UUM International School Melaka Welcomes Visitors from University of Nottingham, Malaysia

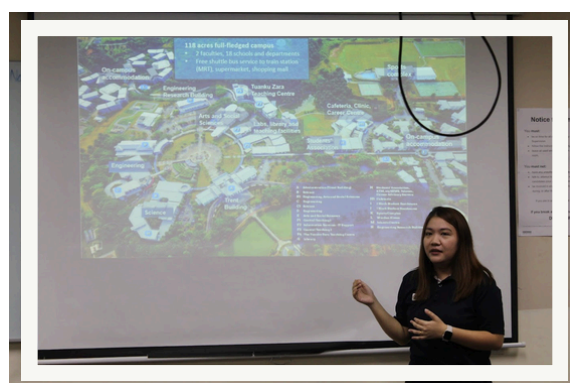
On Thursday, 20th March 2025, at 11:00 AM, UUM International School Melaka had the pleasure of hosting representatives from the University of Nottingham, Malaysia. **Their visit aimed to provide valuable insights and guidance to Year 11 IGCSE students about their higher education options after completing their studies.**

During the session, students were introduced to the foundation programmes offered by the University of Nottingham, Malaysia.

These programmes include:



- **Science Pathway**
- **Engineering and Mathematical Science Pathway**
- **Arts and Social Sciences Pathway**





To be eligible for enrolment in the foundation courses, students must meet the minimum requirement of five subject credits, excluding Moral Studies and Religious Studies. The programme consists of two semesters within one academic year, with tuition fees set at RM38,000 (approximately USD8,700).



Students enrolled in the foundation programme must complete at least 150 Nottingham credits, equivalent to 50 MQA credits. The structure of the programme includes 80–90 credits of core modules and 60–70 credits of optional modules, which vary based on the chosen undergraduate pathway.

The University of Nottingham, Malaysia, also offers financial aid opportunities, including the Dean's Excellence Scholarship and a High Achiever Scholarship, which provides up to 25% tuition fee reduction for outstanding students.



This informative session provided students with a clearer understanding of their academic future and the pathways available to them. UUM International School Melaka extends its gratitude to the University of Nottingham, Malaysia, for their visit and the valuable opportunities they shared with our students.
