The journey began in the small hours of Friday, 24 October as the group assembled at KLIA for their flight to Kansai International Airport. Upon arrival in Osaka, the excitement was palpable! After clearing immigration and meeting the local guide, the group dove straight into their city tour.

First stop: *The Abeno Earthquake Safety Learning Centre*, where students gained insights into Japan's advanced disaster preparedness strategies. The group then headed to the bustling Dotonbori district to take in the riverside sights and sample delectable street food at the many shops there. Later, everyone checked into the hotel for a well-earned rest and dinner.

On Saturday, the group had their hotel breakfast first thing in the morning, then departed for Kyoto, a city renowned for its classical charm. Their time at Kyoto kicked off most fashionably, with participants looking stunning and stylish after renting kimonos and yukatas. This was followed by a pleasant walk through the Arashiyama Bamboo Grove and across the picturesque Togetsukyo Bridge.

Next on the itinerary was a class on how to make matcha tea in a traditional Japanese tea ceremony. Later that afternoon, they visited the Fushimi Inari Shrine, famous for its vermilion torii gates winding up the mountain. The spiritual atmosphere and striking visuals made it a highlight for many.

The day concluded with a return to Osaka and a packed dinner at the hotel, followed by another night-time trip to Dotonbori.



Sunday was all about fun and excitement at Universal Studios Japan! From thrilling rides to immersive attractions, students enjoyed a full day of entertainment and bonding. This was followed by a visit to the iconic Osaka Castle and its serene gardens, offering a glimpse into Japan's feudal history. The group then traveled to Nara, home to some of Japan's most treasured historical sites. There, they first strolled through Nara Park, where friendly deer roamed freely, delighting everyone with their gentle presence.

Next, students walked to **the Todai-ji Temple** and stood in awe before one of the largest wooden structures in the world.
